

2004 TEXAS TROPHY— Update by Doug

On behalf of the Lone Star GCSA I would like to thank all the players and volunteers who helped with the 2004 Texas Trophy Golf Championship in partnership with Professional Turf Products. 100 golfers from the five state chapters vied for bragging rights at Blackhorse Golf Club on September time in the twenty year history of the 12, 13, and 14, 2004.

The festivities began on Sunday, September 12th with a 1 PM shotgun on the south course. Fiftythree teams competed in the best ball mixer. The team of John Aguil-Ion and Andy Morrissette won the gross division with a 66. Followed by a close second were Chris Webster and Mark Cohorn with a 68. Third, fourth and fifth places were the teams of Bret Barclay/Russell Tippie 69. Brad Fryrear/Fernando Palacios 69 and Tem Miller/George B. Manuel 70, respectfully.

This year's net division champions were Jim Curlee and Brent Ratcliff with a 9-under par 63. A scorecard play-off broke the ties for second, third and fourth with a score of 64. Paul Tessman/Kody Key won second, Travis Klosterboer. 



Water Use Information for Water Planning

Because golf course superintendents may not be familiar with the Texas Water Development Board, I would like to take a moment to explain what we do and to request your assistance in providing accurate information that can ultimately help you and your customers.

The TWDB was created to provide water-project financing and to plan for the State's future water needs. In water planning, the TWDB assists 16 Regional Water Planning Groups across the state to plan for future water use and to estimate future water availability. The purpose of the regional planning efforts is to account for all current water uses and to plan for these. If some water usage is not included, then the regions and state are under planning for the future. Thus, both the regional groups and the Board are very interested in getting an accurate picture of water use.

To support these efforts, the TWDB conducts an annual water use survey for cities, utilities, industrial facilities, and commercial/institutional facilities across the state. For irrigation water use, TWDB has historically relied on various estimation techniques, but we do not believe that these techniques have accounted for water use by "non-traditional" irrigation sectors such as golf courses and nursery/landscape growers. For the survey of 2004 water use, we are making an effort to include additional information from these historically under-represented sectors. We currently survey 24 golf facilities, but next February we would like to send a water-use survey to all golf facilities with 18 holes or more. Courses would be surveyed for their annual total water use, the source of the water, and their physical address.

Since the regional water planning process began

in 1997, many dedicated people have become involved in planning for our state's future. However, planning is often only as good as the data upon which it is based. We hope to plan for golf course water use with the most accurate data possible and hope that you, as superintendents, can help us collect this information. 

The design and maintenance of sand bunkers are two of the most commonly debated issues that golf course superintendents must address on a daily basis. Most golf courses with a significant number of sand bunkers require 15 to 25% of the available labor pool hours for routine maintenance. This course will teach superintendents about the numerous factors involved in making informed decisions regarding sand bunker construction, maintenance, and renovation. It will include opportunities for participants to express their opinions and philosophies regarding how sand bunkers should impact golf course playing characteristics.

Learning Objectives:

Gain a knowledge of the history of sand bunkers on golf courses. Understand the design strategy that bunkers provide for the game of golf.

Understand factors which golfers use to form opinions regarding playability of bunkers.

Learn how bunker design and construction impact maintenance of sand bunkers

Identify how sand selection and sand depth impact maintenance and playability of bunkers.

Identify how raking, grooming, moisture content and control, and other surface related cultural practices impact maintenance and playability of bunkers.

Robert M. Randquist, CGCS, is the Director of Golf Course & Grounds, Boca Rio Golf Club, Boca Raton, Florida, since November 1998. He was the golf course superintendent at Southern Hills Country Club in Tulsa, Oklahoma from 1979-1998. Robert earned his bachelor of science degree in metallurgical engineering from the University of Oklahoma. Hosted the 1982 and 1994 PGA Championships; 1995 and 1996 PGA Tour Championships; and the 1987 USGA Women's Mid-Amateur Championship.

This seminar covers good agronomic practices and other available practices to effectively manage water for uniform turf quality. The physio-chemical properties of water, water movement, the interaction of water with soil particles, water use by the plant and factors affecting soil water retention are discussed.

Explain the interactions between soil, water and plant including how turf obtains water from the soil and how soil moisture effects turf quality.

Describe how water moves through soil and the rootzone. Identify water repellency issues other than Localized Dry Spots. Discuss surfactant technologies available to manage water in the soil profile.

Back to the Magic

Popular Orlando-area courses open their doors for the 2005 GCSAA Golf Championship.

The GCSAA Golf Championship has packed its bags for a wide variety of locales in its 53-year history. It has soaked up the sun in the Bahamas, visiting Freeport in 1969. It has traveled south of the border, stopping in Guadalajara, Mexico, in 1980. It's been to three Beaches (Long in 1956, Myrtle in 1983 and Ponte Vedra in 1992) and two Palms (Springs in 1963 and 1989, and Desert in 1986). It's even been to Toledo, Ohio (in 1976).

But this year, the tournament returns to an old friend, Orlando, which has played host to GCSAA's top golf event more times than any other city. 
