



Volunteer Programs

Every golf course has different departments, and each with its own challenges. Most tasks are carried out by employees on the payroll. However some courses have a volunteer program. Again all courses and departments have different challenges, yet with a good volunteer program it could help a department achieve its goals. All volunteer programs are different. It could be for example the most common, a course marshal monitoring pace of play, cart help, range services, or maybe someone just picking up down limbs and trash on the course. The limit on volunteer programs is limited to the amount of imagination planning a program. Less common types of volunteers would be, a person helping with the morning setup of the course mowing, raking bunkers, cup changing, water coolers, restroom detail. It all depends on the course and its rules. On average most golf course volunteers supply a service to the golf course for playing privileges; and most of the time it is by helping players get around the golf course at a normal pace. Volunteers come in all ages, races, and genders. Volunteers are a great advantage to a golf course. Most volunteers work on the course because first they love golf, and second they like interaction with other people.

All it takes is one volunteer to hawk some golf balls while the course is backed up to relay a bad image on the whole program so it is important to set the rules up before they are allowed on the course. It is a good to see the friendly person waving as they drive past you to check on the next group. Most are experienced at the game of golf and understand common golf rules and will have respect for the average player. If the pace of play is good the volunteer could help the course by picking up trash, top dressing some divots, fix ball marks, and sometimes re-fill the cups at the water coolers. All of these small details add up to help make a difference on the golf course. One of the most important parts of keeping volunteers going is making sure they know when a good job is done, and that you noticed it. Small rewards and saying something along the lines of "Thank you very much for what you did for the course today" could keep them happy.

Some volunteers as we all know are great workers, and others..... well let's just say if they picked up the same amount of trash on the course as they found golf balls we would not have anything negative to talk about. Having more than two volunteers is great, but without a set of standards or guidelines to follow all it takes is one "bad egg" of the group to make it unsuccessful. Nobody wants to hear about how "so and so did not do it so why should I do it." I am sure every course has there own set of guidelines to have a successful volunteer program. Some suggestions that could help keep a successful volunteer program:

List of active Volunteers with contact numbers, and duties that they perform, with a limited amount of spots, and maybe a waiting list.

Posted hours of operation and volunteers assignments, with a volunteer leader.

Sign in sheet for volunteers to keep tack of time worked, and task they accomplished.

Whether it is working with the golf shop, course maintenance, or any other department we all could always use some extra help. Since most volunteers on a golf course trade there services for golfing privileges, there are guidelines that must be set to keep yourself and the volunteer out of trouble. Remember the rules are to protect the good volunteer and keep the goals in focus. Every course is different in this area yet here are two simple rules that would be a good starting point:

Rate of pay. (Set a number of hours needed to work for a round of golf. This keeps a balance of golf and service given equal.)

When can they play golf? Examples: no limit, weekday's only, open gap in tee sheet, only after 2:00p.m.

I have been lucky to work with some great volunteers in my past that have made an impact on the course. All the way from an old retired volunteer who only wanted to help mow three days a week for golf, to a young gentleman who wanted to learn how to maintain a golf course, which I am now glad to know is currently a golf course superintendent. Good luck with your golf course volunteer program. They help invest in keeping golf the grand ole game that it is today and what it will be for the next person on the tee tomorrow.


